

**Do not dispose of batteries with household waste!**

Dispose of batteries and accumulators separately from other waste at designated collection points.



You can dispose of (rechargeable) batteries free of charge at the following locations:

- Anywhere new batteries are sold.
- In stores (supermarkets, hardware stores, electronic stores, etc.)
- At recycling centres
- At other municipal or local collection points



Old batteries can contain hazardous substances that can damage the environment if disposed of improperly.



Batteries and accumulators may contain substances that are harmful to human health or the environment, or pose other hazards. In particular, handling lithium-ion batteries requires special care due to various risks. By collecting and recycling old batteries and accumulators separately, you help prevent negative impacts on human health and the environment.



The separate collection of batteries enables recycling and thus helps conserve valuable raw materials.



Before returning lithium-ion batteries and accumulators, cover the terminals with adhesive tape. This prevents potential short circuits. Always dispose of lithium-ion batteries separately from other types of batteries.
